
## WHERE MONTRÉAL BEGAN

**ELEMENTARY CYCLES 2 AND 3 • SECONDARY CYCLE 1**

Inside the new pavilion at Pointe-à-Callière, Fort Ville-Marie, students can see some actual traces of the first settlement built by Montréal's founders. In an immersive space filled with sound and light, they'll hear the touching tale of these men and women and their arrival on a fertile point of land, how they adapted to the difficult conditions and their relations with both friendly and hostile First Nations. The tour will lead students across a glass floor overlooking the remains of Fort Ville-Marie. They can also take a stroll through Montréal's first collector sewer and enjoy an impressive immersive experience with the Memory Collector light installation.

### ELEMENTARY

Long before Europeans arrived, the St. Lawrence Iroquoians built villages of longhouses on Montréal Island and all along the St. Lawrence River. See how they lived from day-to-day, how they used the furs and bones of the animals they hunted, how they prepared their daily meals, and more. Your students will be captivated by the ingenuity and know-how of the members of this aboriginal nation. Can they use the same skills?

## NATIVES ON THE POINT

### ELEMENTARY CYCLE 2 • SECONDARY CYCLES 1 AND 2

Lots has happened on the Pointe à Callière site over the centuries, for travellers were forced to stop here by the Lachine rapids. Native people spent time here, at first fishing and gathering food, and then later to attend the annual fur fair with the French, and to sign the Great Peace treaty in Montréal in 1701. Your students will explore the site's Indigenous history with the help of models, artifacts and remains.

### ELEMENTARY CYCLE 3 • SECONDARY CYCLE 1

We've come a long way since people used to draw their drinking water straight from the St. Lawrence and dump their wastewater in the street. Water has a whole history of its own. In this multidisciplinary workshop, your students will be joined by our friendly mascot, Romeo the sewer rat, as they learn how Montrealers found ingenious ways to manage this precious resource all the way back to the 17<sup>th</sup> century. They'll be immersed in some vital issues – access to drinking water and wastewater management through the years, right up until today.

## ARCHAEO-ADVENTURE

### ELEMENTARY CYCLES 2 AND 3 • SECONDARY CYCLE 1

This workshop is the perfect opportunity to find out what archaeologists do. Under the supervision of a chief archaeologist (interpreter-guide), your students will use the scientific approach to conduct an investigation. They'll dig in the ground, find traces from the days when First Nations people camped here right up until the British regime, analyze their finds in a laboratory and learn how people lived in days gone by.




