## Craft Project Treasure Map Board Game




## **Material**

Sheet of paper of any size
Concentrated coffee or tea
Gouache or watercolour paint
Paintbrush
Water
Lead pencil
Plastic sheet to protect your work surface

For the game: a die and game pieces (various small objects)

## **Instructions**

1. Tear off the edges of the sheet of paper and make some inward tears in a few spots.



**2**. Place your sheet of paper on a plastic protector to prevent staining your work surface. Using a paintbrush, coat both sides of the paper with concentrated coffee or tea. Let the paper dry. You can speed up the drying process with a hair dryer. For the concentrated coffee, ask an adult to give you some very strong coffee or some tea steeped in very little water.



. Now that your parchment paper is ready, you can start to draw your treasure map. Using your lead pencil, start by drawing two big "S" shapes, in parallel, leaving some space between the two. Now divide that space into game squares.



. Number the squares, leaving 4 of them empty to use as special squares. Two of these will be "skull" squares and two will be "ship" squares.



. Draw some island details all around the path of game squares. Add palm trees, mountains, and waves in the water beyond the island. Don't forget to draw a treasure chest after the last game square!

**6**. Once you've drawn all of the details, use your gouache or watercolours to paint them in. Let the paint dry.







Now it's time to play the game! Take your die and give a game piece to each player. Have each player take turns rolling the die, advancing their game pieces according to the number rolled on the die. Players that land on a skull square must go back 2 spaces; players that land on a ship square get to move ahead 2 spaces. The first player to get to the treasure wins the game!
