

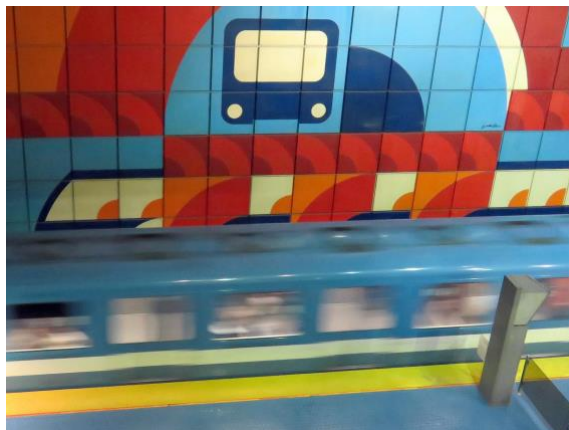
Paper Mosaic

Material

Construction paper corresponding to the colours of the image

Scissors

Glue stick

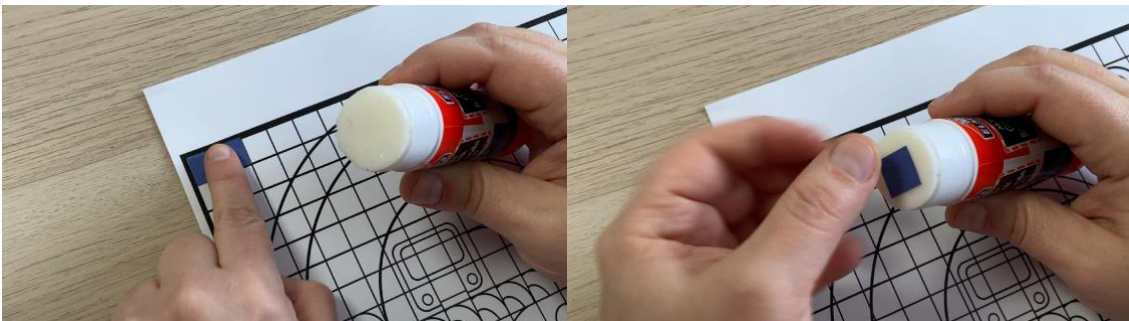
Image with or without printed numbers (at the end of this document)

Steps for making the paper mosaic

1. Prepare the construction paper by cutting out strips about a centimetre in width; then cut the strips into 1 cm² paper tiles.



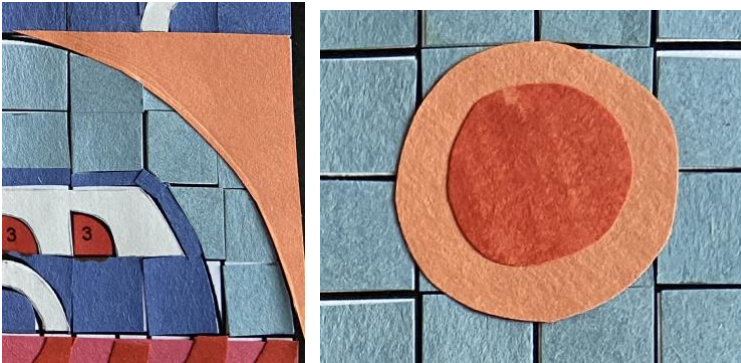
2. One by one, glue the paper tiles into the right spaces, referring to the colour image or to the numbers. Complete the image.



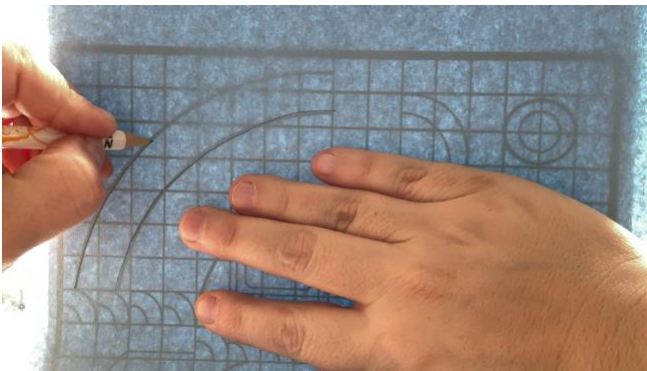
A few tips...

Here are a few tips to help make your mosaic work a bit easier and quicker!

1. You can cut out larger pieces of construction paper to fill in larger spaces. You can also stick shapes on top of each other to avoid having to cut out fine details.



2. You can trace the more difficult shapes by putting your tracing sheet and construction paper against a window. Then, all you need to do is cut out and glue!

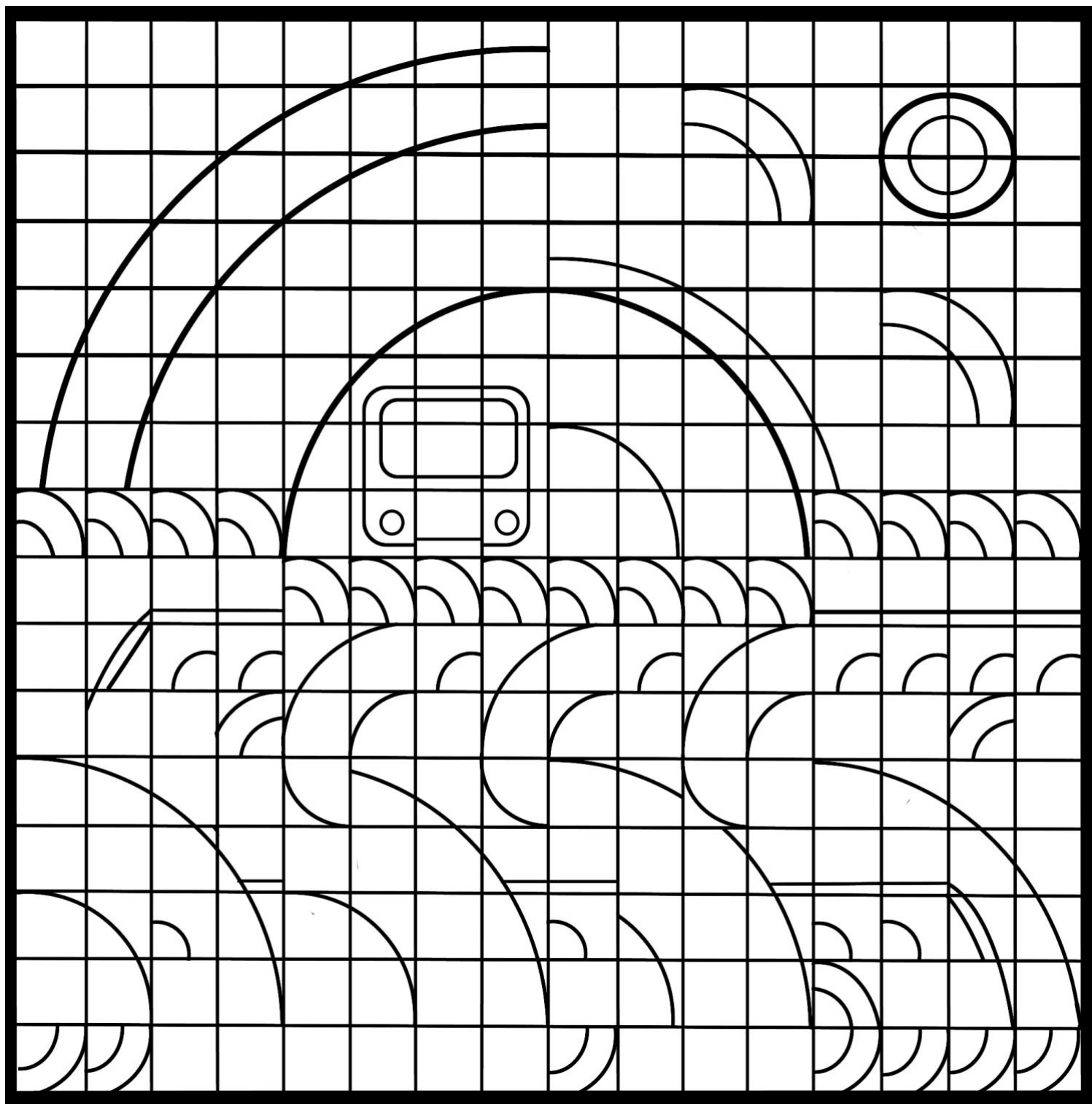


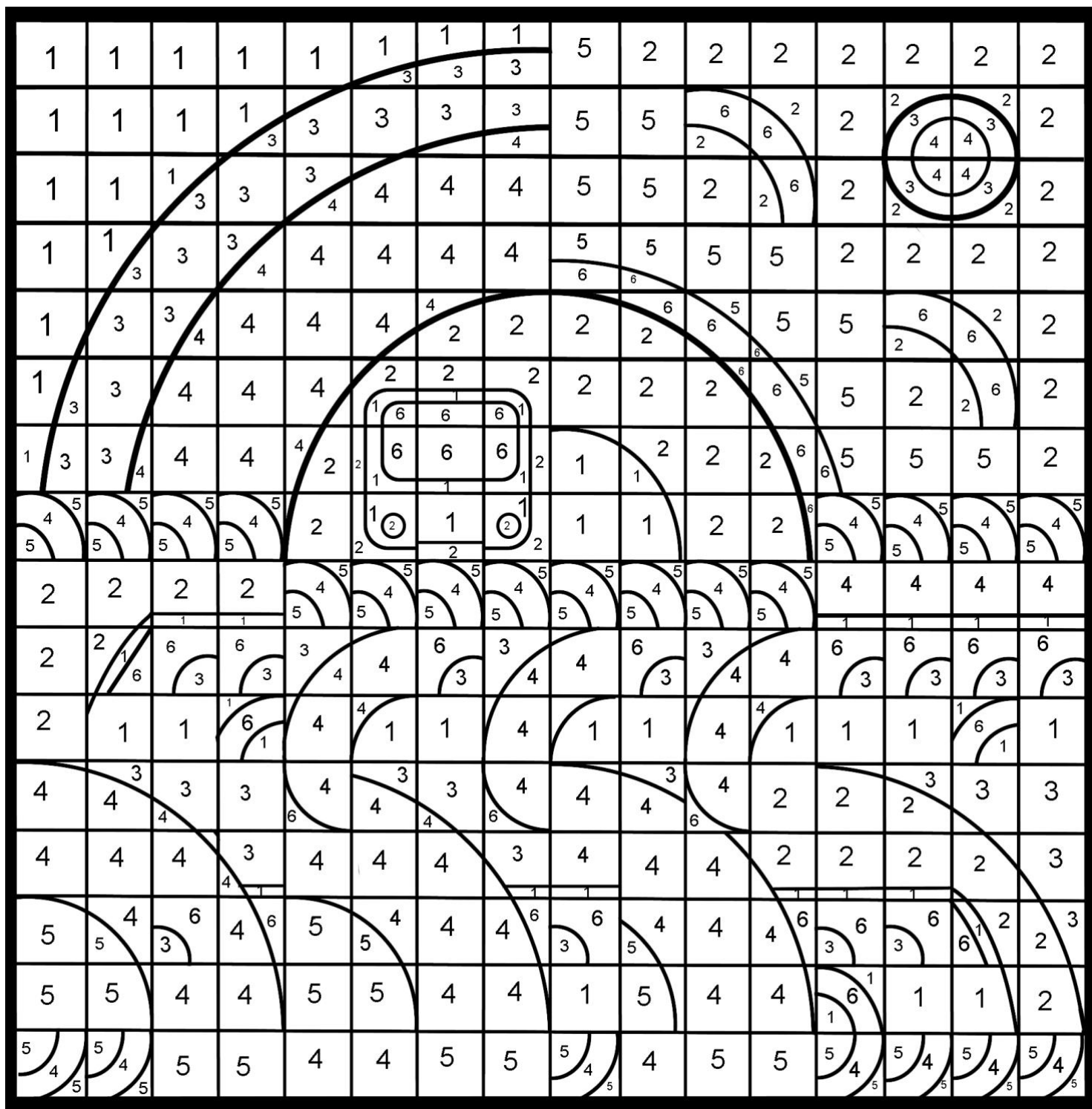
3. If you don't have all the colours of paper you need, you can use felt markers to colour over lighter coloured paper to make it darker (for example, using an orange marker to colour over orange paper, making a darker shade of orange).
