




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BEFORE YOUR VISIT

Getting around

- > You can download a museum map <u>HERE</u>. Paper maps are available at the Museum.
- You can download an accessibility and sensory map of the Museum <u>HERE</u>. This map indicates areas with different levels of lighting, noise, and traffic that could pose specific accessibility challenges.



MUSEUM ENTRANCE








> Push this button to open the door automatically.






> Lobby

> This is also where school groups assemble. There may be many children here.




> There is a receptionist or security guard at the Museum entrance to provide assistance if needed.





TICKETS

> You need a ticket to visit Pointe-à-Callière. You can purchase them at the ticket counter. This is also where you validate tickets purchased online or membership cards.



- > If you are a Museum member, use the line with the sign "MEMBERS — Fast Pass Access" to present your card and register your visit.
- > If you purchased your ticket online, use line with the sign "ELECTRONIC TICKETS" to present your ticket.
- > If you have not yet purchased a ticket, use line with the sign "PURCHASE TICKETS" to purchase a ticket.
- > Waiting time may be longer at peak periods.
- > View the various entrance fees here: RATES

Admission is free for individuals accompanying visitors with a disability (visual, hearing, motor, intellectual, or physical) upon presentation of a Companion Leisure Card (CAL) or ACCESS 2 card at the Museum reception desk.



TICKETS

> Feel free to ask for a map of the Museum at the reception desk.



- > The reception desk attendant will be happy to answer any questions you may have.
- > WHEELCHAIRS are available to be borrowed. Please ask a reception agent and provide a piece of ID. Return the wheelchair at the end of your visit to collect your ID.
- > Five SENSORY BAGS are available at the Museum reception desk. They are designed to provide autistic and non-autistic visitors and their carers with the tools they need to enjoy a pleasant, relaxing visit. They are available at the reception desk upon presentation of a piece of ID. Return the sensory bag to the reception desk after your visit to collect your ID.





WASHROOMS AND COAT CHECK

> There are **washrooms in the Museum lobby**. There are also washrooms in other locations in the Museum:

In Fort Ville-Marie (green area on map)

In Old Custom House (pink area on map)

In Mariners' House (blue area on map)

- > Washrooms are shown with the following symbol:
- > There is **one coat check** in the Museum lobby and another in the basement of **Mariners' House** (blue area).
- > Coat checks are shown with this symbol:
- You may leave items at the coat check and collect them after your visit. The coat check is free of charge and self-serve. You may also lock items in a locker with a \$1 coin. You will need to bring your own \$1 coin (follow the instructions).












> You will see these symbols on maps and throughout the Museum:



- > You can start your visit with the multimedia show, which presents key events of Montréal history.
- > Enter the show from the lobby. There are shows every 30 minutes. A screen near the entrance shows the next show time.





- > The show takes place in a dark room, with multiple screens and changes in lighting. You'll need to wear headphones to hear the audio.

 The volume is adjustable.
- > The film contains sequences of flashing lights that may bother you if you have issues related to photosensitivity.





- > You may ask for assistance from Museum staff at any time.
 Guides and security agents in the Museum are there to assist you and provide information. Pointe-à-Callière staff are trained to accommodate people with disabilities.
- > If you are lost, need something, or do not feel well, they are there to help.







> You will see very old archeological remains in the Museum. To avoid damaging them, please look but don't touch.





- > There are several different self-guided tours of the Museum.
- > Look at the map to see which suits you best.
- > Feel free to ask a Museum staff member for advice.
- > You may also simply visit the Museum without following a route.
