In addition to its **four temporary exhibitions**, including the fascinating **Olmecs and the Civilizations of the Gulf of Mexico**, the Museum has scheduled a ton of **free and festive activities** in an urban oasis, comfortably furnished in a pedestrianized area outdoors. An ideal spot to take advantage of summer in Montréal.

# Programming

This year, <u>Summer on the Pointe</u> offers an abundant program, mainly inspired by the temporary exhibition <u>Olmecs and the Civilizations of the Gulf of Mexico</u> and developed alongside Montréal community and arts organizations. The <u>Block Party</u> (Saturday, June 15, 2024, from 2 pm to 10 pm) will kick off the summer program, which continues with flagship <u>Musical Middays</u> events (every Thursday, July 4 through August 15, 2024, from noon to 1 pm) and <u>Family Sundays</u> (every Sunday, July 7 through August 18, 2024, from 1 pm to 4 pm).

The very popular <u>18<sup>th</sup> Century Public Market</u> will also be back (Saturday, August 24, 2024, from 10 am to 7 pm, and Sunday, August 25, 2024, from 10 am to 6 pm). A journey back in time to market day in New France. It's quite the program!

To our visitors' great delight, certain streets will be closed to traffic for the summer season, from Friday, May 3 to Tuesday, September 3, 2024. They are: Place D'Youville, between Saint-François-Xavier Street and Place Royale East, as well as Place Royale West, between De la Capitale Street and Place D'Youville.

A warm and friendly space has been set up around the complex for the public to enjoy. Street furniture in summer colours will provide visitors, neighbourhood residents, and local professionals with a relaxing environment that is also conducive to discovery.

## **BLOCK PARTY**

A neighbourhood highlight, this event kicks off the Museum's summer program. Pointe-à-Callière invites neighbours and culture-lovers to come join the party! Held in collaboration with the **Corridor Culturel**, this entertainingly creative afternoon and evening features artistic, musical, and dance performances for everyone to enjoy.

On this special, friendly, and accessible day for one and all, the exhibition <u>Olmecs and the</u> <u>Civilizations of the Gulf of Mexico</u> will exceptionally remain open from 5 pm to 8 pm (\$).

D'Youville, artifacts discovered on the archaeological site will transport you back to the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century, a time when Montréal became the country's capital! To complement your visit, also see the outdoor exhibition *A Parliament Under Your Feet*, where you can stroll right over the market's remains.
