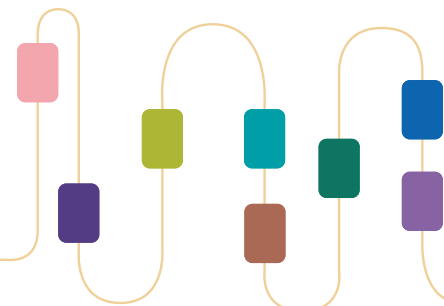

Route Outline

STATION 1 – MAKING PEACE

Take some time to explore the Great Peace zone of the *Crossroads Montréal* exhibition, which details the event of 1701. It includes a new video installation featuring testimonials on the symbolic significance of this peace.



STATION 2 – EXCHANGING

This marker highlights the central role of trade in the Great Peace of Montréal. See the second model on the ground, which represents Montréal in 1701.



STATION 3 – AGREEING

The timeline traces the history of Montréal as an Indigenous territory and a French city. Before retracing your steps, learn about the essential role of interpreters.



STATION 4 – MOVING FORWARD

Make your way through the collector sewer, a symbol of the path taken by nations to achieve peace, both physically and diplomatically.



STATION 5 – NEGOTIATING

Learn about Montréal as a late 17th century trade hub. Answer the interactive questionnaire: would you have made a good ambassador for peace?



STATION 6 – COMMITTING

Ascend to the glass floor level. An intimate and moving encounter awaits you around an exceptional document.

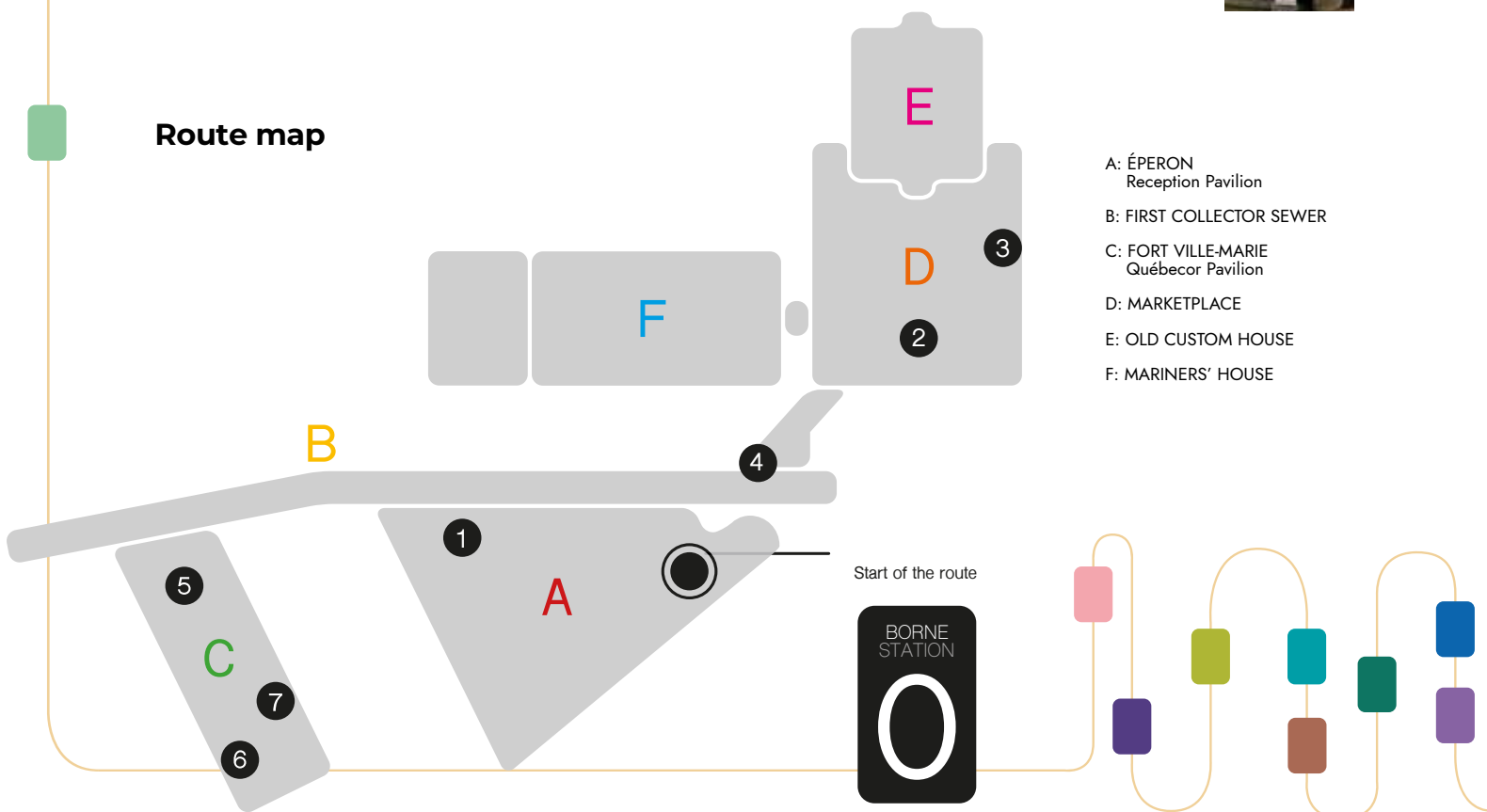


STATION 7 – KEEPING ONE'S WORD
